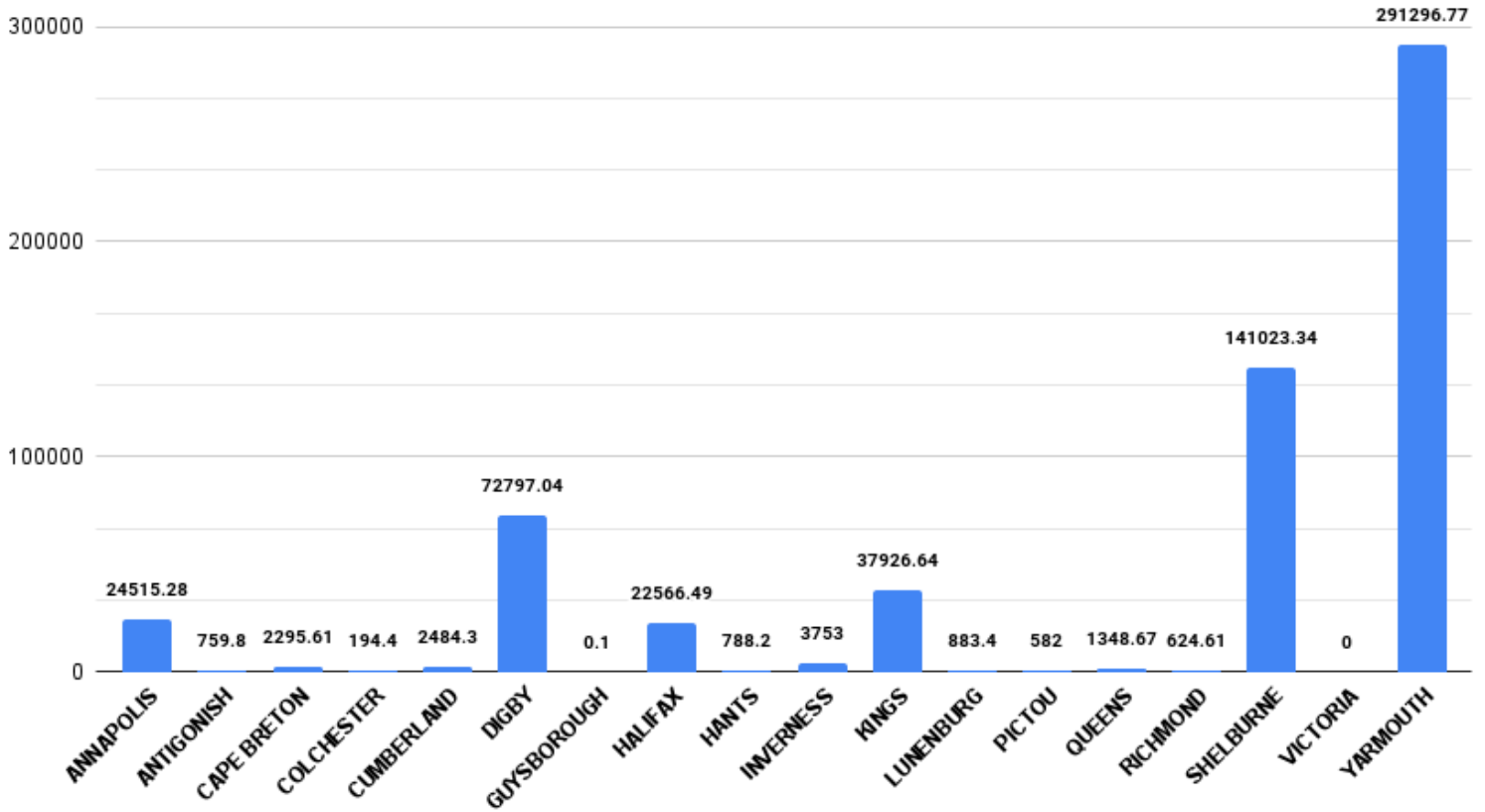

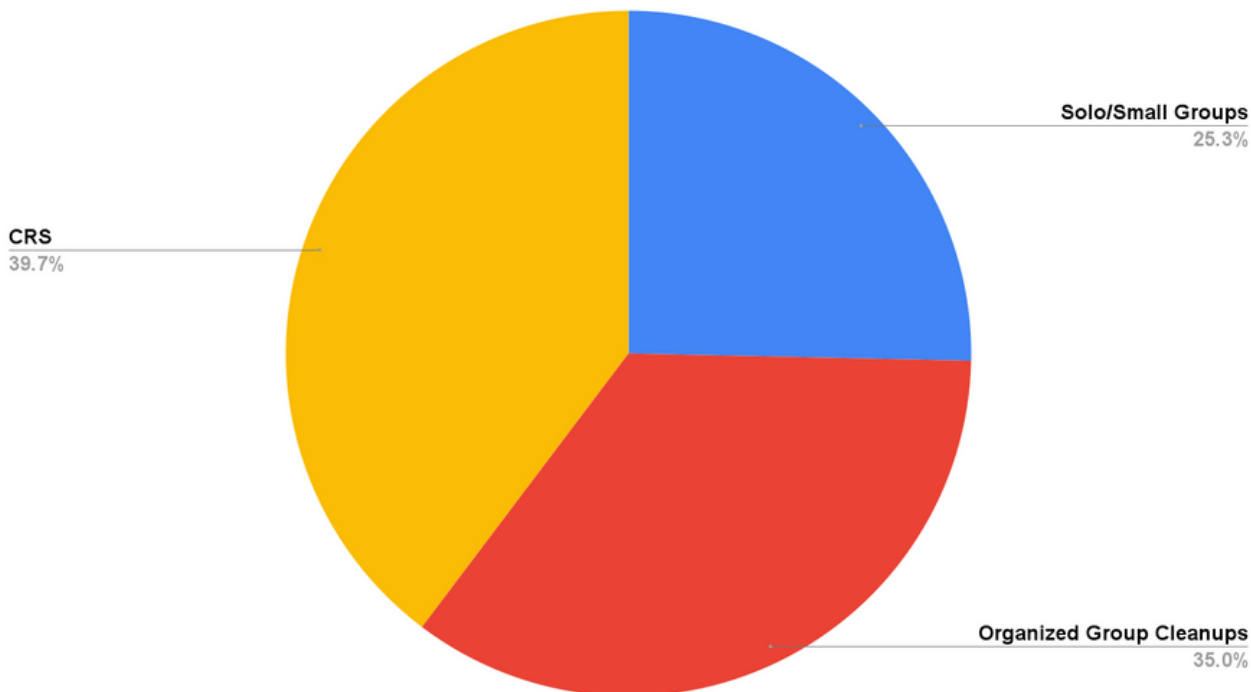
Fall Highlights
